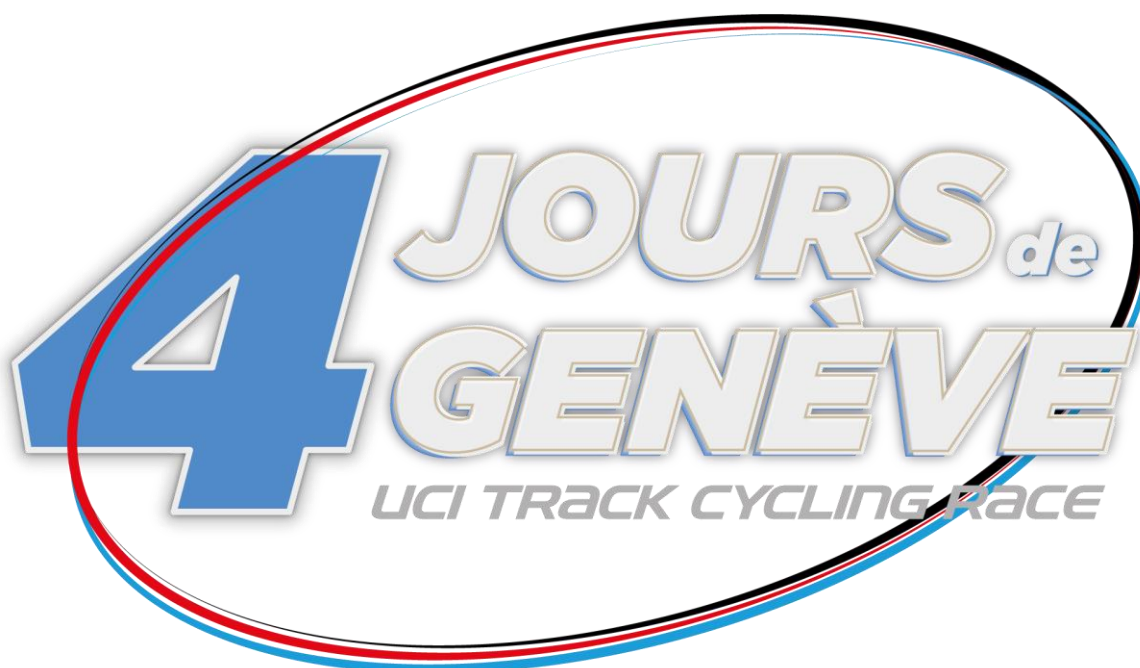

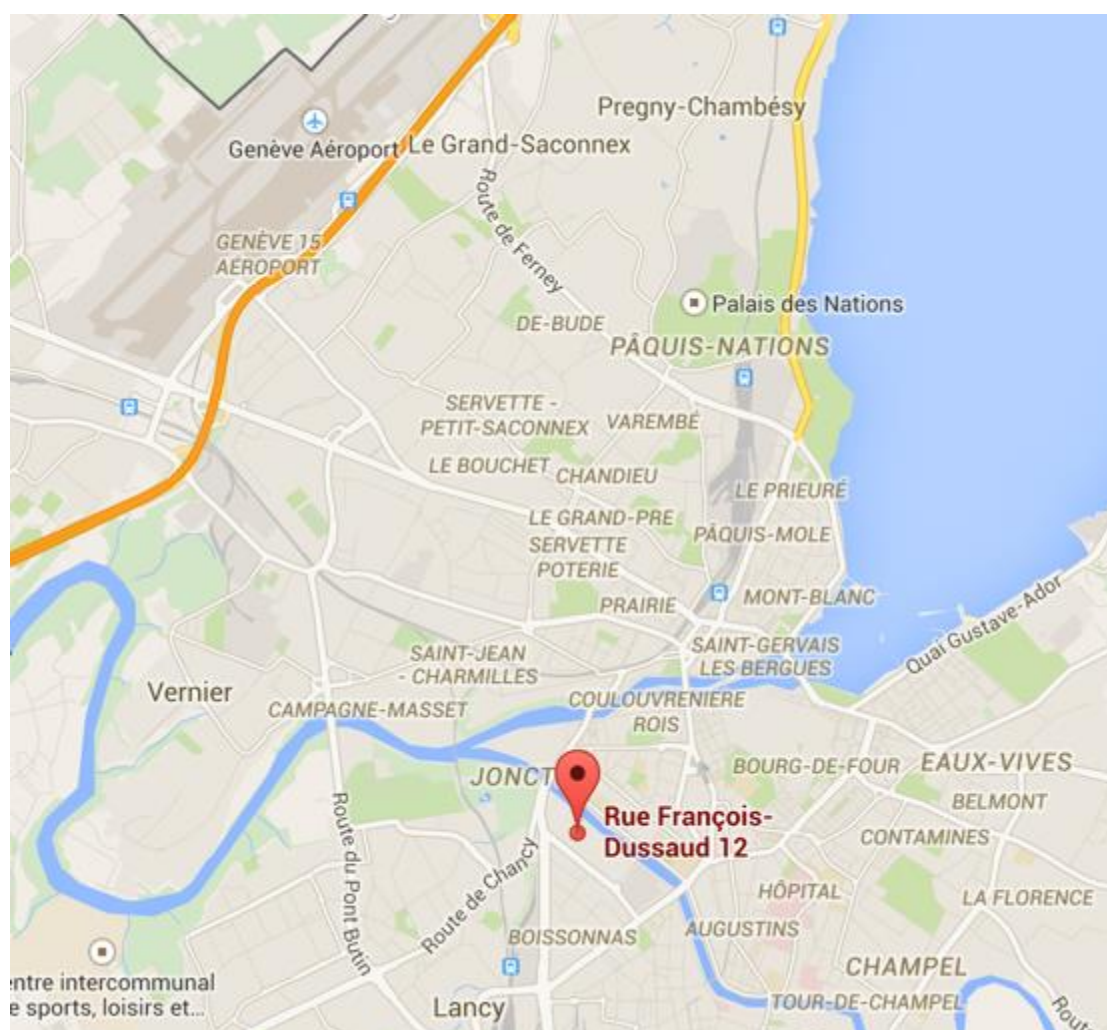

Registration

Entries for the Juniors, Cadets and Women B categories can be made directly on the 4 Jours de Genève website.

Elites Women and Men registration: on request to the organiser (Full)

A minimum of 10 UCI points is required to take part in UCI races.

Registration for UCI races: no registration changes may be made less than 24 hours before the event.

UCI Women Race

A qualifying race with 2 heats will be held for each UCI race, with the first 8 classified qualifying for the finals.

Scratch qualifier: Thursday - Qualifying heats: Thursday - Omnium qualifier: Saturday

UCI scratch race final: Friday - Elimination final: Friday - Omnium final: Sunday

UCI Men's Race

A qualifying race with 2 heats will be held for each UCI race, with the first 5 classified qualifying for the finals.

Scratch qualifier: Thursday - Qualifying elimination heats: Thursday - Omnium qualifier: Saturday

UCI scratch race final: Friday - Elimination final: Friday - Omnium final: Sunday

Brackets' Limitations:

Ecoliers: bracket limited to 6m85

Cadets: bracket limited to 7m03

Juniors and Féminines B: bracket limited to 7m25

Women Elite and Men Elite: **Free bracket**

Categories:

« Cadets » races are opened to riders from the « Cadets » category (U17 - Born in 2009 and 2010).

« Féminines B » races are opened to women riders from the « Cadets » (U17) category and the « Juniors » (U19) category (Born between 2007 and 2010).

« Juniors » races are opened to riders from the « Juniors » category (U19 - Born in 2007 and 2008).

If some places are still available for the Juniors category, organizers may authorize the participation of « Amateurs » riders (U23 and Master) who are not selected in the Elite category. To do so, an e-mail must be sent to the organizer to make a request.

Women Elite races are opened to riders from the Women Elite categories (National Elite, International Elite) on a registration basis.

Men Elite races are opened to riders from the Men Elite categories (National Elite, International Elite) on a registration basis.

Riders from the « Féminines » category have their meals at the Geneva Velodrome on Friday (Dinner only), Saturday (Lunch and dinner) and Sunday (Lunch only).

Riders from the Women Elite category have their meals at the Geneva Velodrome on Thursday (Dinner only), Friday (Lunch and dinner), Saturday (Lunch and dinner) and Sunday (Lunch only).

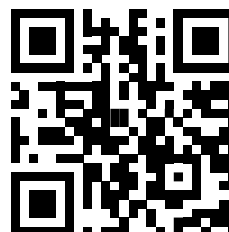

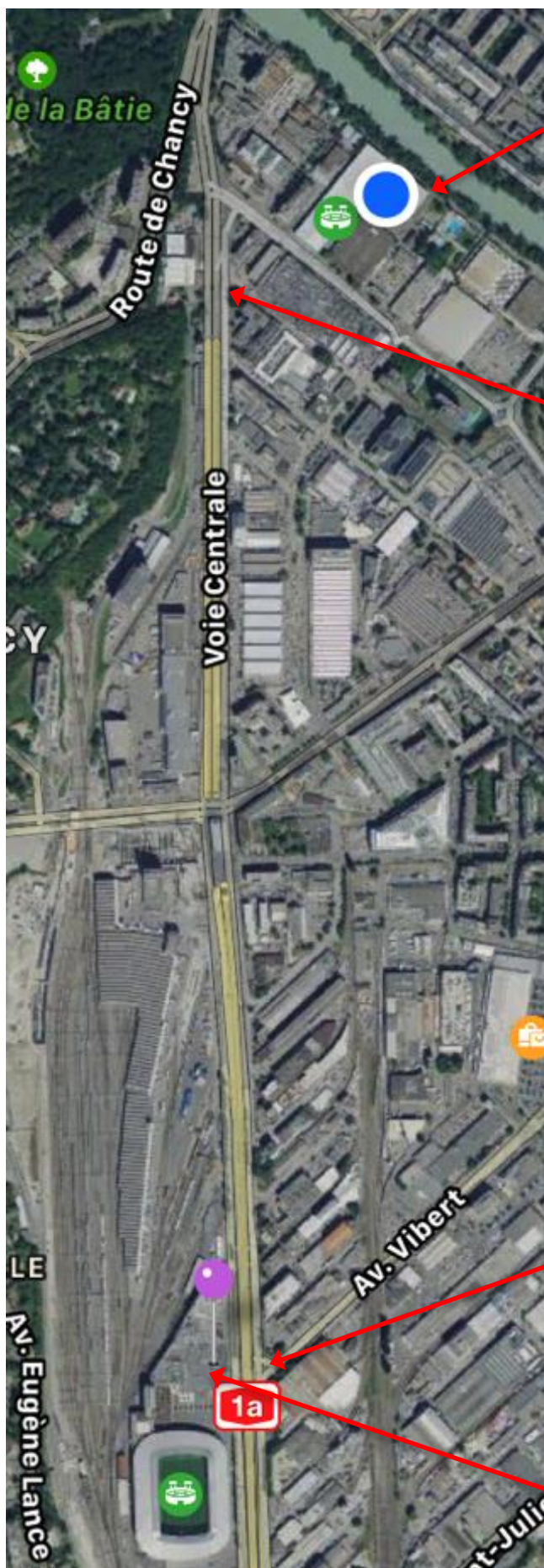

Race Regulations

Distribution of race-bibs and transponders and SD meeting:

- Thursday from 14:15 to 15:15
- Friday from 16:00 to 17:00
- Saturday from 12:00 to 12:30

Two race-bibs and one transponder will be provided in exchange for a deposit or the licence.

Sports Directors Meeting

Thursday, November 27, at 15:30, in the meeting room (Downstairs turn n°1 of the Velodrome)

Start of the first race:

Even bibs are placed in the sprinters lane and odd bibs start from the railing.

Then the starts are in the order of the general classification.

For the UCI races, starts are in the order of the UCI ranking.

Races Regulations:

For all the races (Points Race, Scratch, Elimination Race, Keirin, etc...) UCI regulations for track races are applied.

Handicap Race:

The handicap race is a race which takes place over 6 laps. Each rider starts every 10 meters in the opposite direction of the general classification established before this race. Riders can place themselves between the bottom of the blue band, also called *Côte d'Azur*, and the red line. Riders will be held by trainers, they can be pushed, but the feet of the trainer must not move.

If the number of participants is greater than 10, two series will be organized: a "small final" with the riders classified in the 2nd half of the provisional classification of the day (the selection can also be made within two places between two riders in order to maintain sportsmanship between the athletes), and a "final" with the riders classified in the 1st half of the provisional classification of the day.

In the day's classification, riders of the "small final" will score the number of points corresponding to their position at the finish, increased by the number of participants in the final (for example, for 16 participants in the Handicap Race, riders of the "small final" will score the number of points corresponding to their position; participants in the "final" will score 40, 38, 36 ... points).

The President of the Commissaires' Panel can announce a false start depending on the events of the race (puncture, early start, taking off shoes, etc...).

Flying Lap :

Each rider has 3 and a half laps to launch himself and the 4th lap is timed.

Team Flying Lap:

Each team has 4 and a half laps to launch himself and the 5th lap is timed.

Madison :

For safety and technicality reasons of the Geneva track, participation is reserved for experienced riders who have participated in Madison trainings at the Geneva Velodrome, or who have already participated in several Madisons (American) before on other velodromes (provide at least 2 rankings when registering). The number of teams is limited to 12.

The UCI regulations for Six-Day races will be applied.

Pairs of jerseys will be provided. They must be returned at the end of each day for cleaning.

Madison's jerseys must be worn on all races of the 4 days.

Madison UCI : Leading laps does not count towards the overall classification

Women Madison: 120 laps (sprint every 10 laps)

Men Madison: 180 laps (sprint every 10 laps)

Surprise Race :

The surprise race is an endurance race that is raced like a points race. The difference is that sprints are not known in advance (The organizers must give the sprint laps to the commissaires before the start of the race). Commissaires will hold up a red flag 2 laps before each sprint. (Points doubled in the last sprint)

Sprints = 5 – 3 – 2 – 1 points

The number of sprints will be known before the start. The laps gained count. In case of litigation, the UCI points race regulations will be applied.

Supersprint :

The Supersprint is an endurance race that starts out as a Team Elimination race and when there are only 5 teams left on the track, the race turns into a Madison over 15 laps.

Longest Lap:

The start takes place at the opposite line, riders roll slowly towards the right finish line. When all the riders are on the track, the starter starts the stopwatch for 3 minutes on the spot. The front wheel of the riders must not cross the black line, nor the finish line. Riders are not allowed to put a foot on the ground, nor to touch an opponent.

After 2 minutes the starter whistles and the remaining riders set off for two laps.

The classification is made in order of arrival of the sprint, then in the reverse direction of the riders eliminated during the first 3 minutes.

General Classification of « 4 Jours de Genève » – Cadets - Ecoliers:

For each race contested except the last one (points race), each rider will score points in the general classification according to the following scale:

1st : 40 points ; 2nd : 38 points ; 3rd : 36 points ; 4th : 34 points ; 5th : 32 points ;

6th : 30 points ; 7th : 28 points ; 8th : 26 points ; 9th : 24 points ; 10th : 22 points ;

11th : 20 points ; 12th : 18 points ; 13th : 16 points ; 14th : 14 points ; 15th : 12 points ;

16th : 10 points ; 17th : 8 points.

For the last race (points race), the points obtained during the sprints, as well as the points gained or lost for the laps ahead or behind will be added to the points of the provisional general classification before the start of this last race (same principle as for the UCI omnium).

Riders who abandon during the race will be awarded 0 (zero) points.

Riders stopped by the commissaires during the race due to too many laps lost from the main group will be given the place they occupied when coming off the track.

Riders who do not take the start of a race will be awarded 0 points, except for the last points race where they will be given a DNS.

At the end of the 2 days of competition, the total number of points obtained will determine the general classification, the rider having obtained the greatest number of points being classified first.

In the event of a tie, the ranking obtained during the last sprint of the last event (points race) will be decisive.

General Classification of « 4 Jours de Genève » – Juniors, Women Elite, Men Elite :

The general classification of the 4 Days Juniors, Women Elite and Men Elite will be done by adding the number of laps gained or lost in the Madisons. In the event of a tie in the number of laps, the teams will be separated by the number of points acquired in the 4 Days races. In the event of a tie in the laps and in the total points acquired, the teams will be separated by the number of points acquired in the last race disputed, and in the event of a new tie, the ranking of the final sprint will be decisive.

The rider who abandons an individual race scores 0 points.

The team that abandons a team race scores as many points as the last classified and the same number of laps lost + 1 lap.

The rider who does not start an individual race scores 8 points + 1 lap.

The team who does not start a team race scores 0 points + 2 laps.

Riders stopped by referees during an individual race will not be subject of any penalty points, they will be classified according to the number of riders remaining in the race at the time of the decision.

Riders stopped by referees during a Madison will not be subject of any penalty points, they will be classified according to the number of teams remaining in the race at the time of the decision. An additional lap will be added with respect to the last team of the race.

Attention: during this event the rule of 100 pts = 1 bonus lap is applied.

The 100 pts rule applies until the penultimate race of the 4 days. The sprints' points are all doubled during the final Madison.

Points awarding for the « 4 jours de Genève » individual races

Team Flying Lap, Scratch, Longest Lap :

1st 10 points, 2nd 7 points, 3rd 6 points, 4th 5 points, 5th 4 points, 6th 3 points, 7th 2 points, 8th 1 points.

Points awarding for the « 4 jours de Genève » team races

Team Elimination Race, Supersprint, Madison (*Madisons' sprints points do not count for the general classification*)

1st 20 points, 2nd 14 points, 3rd 12 points, 4th 10 points, 5th 8 points, 6th 7 points, 7th 6 points, 8th 5 points, 9th 4 points, 10th 3 points, 11th 2 points, 12th 1 point.

The organizers reserve the right to exclude a rider and / or his entourage from the race or the event if their behaviour is deemed disrespectful or dangerous. The organizers reserve the right to impose 1 penalty lap and a fine of CHF 200 /each to the offending riders.

Bouquets Distribution:

A bouquet will be given to the winner of each category during the final podium.

Prizes :

Prizes will be given to all the categories of the general classification. The award ceremony will take place within 30 minutes maximum after the last race of the « 4 jours de Genève ».

Only riders present and in their « 4 jours de Genève » jersey and racing outfit will receive their prizes !

Prizes for the Women Elite and Men Elite categories will be paid by bank transfer 3 days after the race.

Bike Parking:



Riders can leave their bikes in the riders' room; this room will be locked every evening.

Opening of the track:

Riders can access the track of the Geneva Velodrome on:

- Tuesday, November 25, from 8:00 to 20:00
- Wednesday, November 26, from 8:00 to 17:30
- Thursday, November 27, from 9:00 to 16:15

Responsibility:

The organizers decline all responsibility in the event of an accident.

Each rider must hold a personal accident insurance.

For unforeseen cases, Swiss Cycling and UCI regulations will be applied.
